

Fundraising at school

Artwork auction

Get creative for whales & dolphins! In your art class at school, perhaps you can create some whale and dolphin artwork – paintings, models, mosaics etc. Then hold a fun auction to raise awareness and important funds!

Whale & dolphin concert

If you belong to a school orchestra or band, why not give a charity concert and charge an entrance fee to be donated to WDCS. Or, if you like drama, put on a whale and dolphin play instead!

Raffle or sale

Run a raffle, asking friends and family if they can donate goodies (books, toys, biscuits and chocolates etc.) for you to use as prizes. Or you could organise a cake or 'healthy eating' sale at school break time!
