

Save the Whale Week Fundraising Ideas

General ideas if you can't throw a party:

- Organise a sponsored RED themed activity
- Hold a red themed coffee morning at home/work/school
- Hold a red themed cake, cookie or biscuit sale at home/work/school
- Hold a quiz night at your local pub or club (see Whale Quiz)
- Organise a 'Wear Red' to Work or School day

Dinner/Party ideas;

At home, ask your guests to:

- Make a donation in return for lunch (ask them to consider what they would pay to eat lunch out somewhere)
- Dress for dinner, with a fine for anyone who doesn't make the effort
- Play games at £1 a go (see Blowholes & Flukes game)
- Tip the waiter
- Pay a fine for any show of poor table manners
- Bid to avoid doing the washing up

At work you could:

- Provide a Desk Service – bring lunch to people's desks in return for a donation
- Get everyone to bring some food to share and ask for a donation to take part
- If you have a staff canteen add £1 to the cost of lunch for that day (ask the suppliers to make a donation too)
- Hold a quiz themed lunch and collect a fee for entry (see Whale Quiz)
- Print off your tastiest tried & tested recipes and sell them to your colleagues
- Ask your employer to match whatever you raise for WDCS

At school:

- If you have a school canteen add £1 to the cost of lunch for that day (ask the suppliers to make a donation too)
- Bring a packed lunch and donate what you would have spent in the canteen
- In Home Economics cook biscuits or cakes to sell to other classes
- Hold a lunch time quiz and collect a fee for entry (see Whale Quiz)
- Hold an after-lunch speaking competition that people pay to enter – as you're raising money for whales, you could talk about WDCS and the Stop Whaling campaign.
